I fully realize that you won't hear the "old-fashioned" preaching in the average Protestant church. A young pastor from Nebraska called me recently speaking of the condition of the ministry. I asked him, "Pastor, do

3. God leads his once blind but chosen people in the way which they know not, as it relates to the means and progress of their sanctification. 


Radio Station Changes

BIBLE PROPHECY EXPLAINED AND EXPOUNDED God's Prophecy and Israel's Future SERIES F, NO. 7

he Israelites or Jews will be brought back to their own native land in much greater numbers than are there now. In some few cases the prophets would refer and have in mind Israel's return from their exile like as mentioned in Jeremiah 29:10. Most of the times however, references in these passages concerning Israel's return to take place long after meaning, "to return a second time." You will find these words in Isaiah 11:11 and Jeremiah 12:15. This return will witness the Hebrew people coming back to Palestine in great numbers, and the phrase in Jeremiah 29:14, "from all the nations" means just that. The Hebrew people in Palestine today will tell you that there are Jews there from between 105 and 110 nations. The prophets declare that Israel will abide in the land permanently (Jer. 24:6), "I will set my face upon them for good. I will bring them again to this land. I will build them and not pull them down. I will plant them and not pluck them up." This has not taken place yet, permanently. The statement is made several times "The Jews will be in their land safely". The theme of dwelling safely is often expressed in Jeremiah. For example, (33:16) "In those days shall Judah be saved, and Ierusalem shall dwell safely: and this is the name wherewith she shall be called, Jehovah our righteousness." Another thing you will notice in studying prophecy which is of deep interest; and that is, prophecies which speak of the future are related to the matter of righteousness. You remember when Paul preached to the Athenians (Acts 17), he made plain to them that when Christ returned He would judge the world "in righteous-

ness." The apostle Peter (2 Pet. 3:13) tells us that the earth will be "renewed in righteousness."

JEWS WORLDWIDE WILL REUNITED IN ONE NATION. The prophet Ezekiel (ch. 37:15-28) makes clear that all these prophecies will be fulfilled literally on earth in behalf of the Israelites. Regardless of what some of the older Commentaries and Calvin wrote, Jewish prophecies and promises will not be applied to the church. You cannot mix the two. And God says you give offense if you try to do it - 1 Cor. 10:32. I know what the scholars taught on prophecy through the nineteenth century, 18th, 17th, 16th and further back. But they were wrong in saying that the prophecies and promises which God made to the Jews would be fulfilled in blessings to the church. You will note in reading what the apostle Paul said in speaking of the great Decalogue passage that we were to "honor father and mother by which the Lord would give long life in the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee." You will note Paul did not say to these Ephesians (Greek Pagans) that this land was given to them, he said that "it may be well with thee, and thou mayest live long on the earth." This is an entirely different matter, if you read Exodus 20:12 and Ephesians 6:1-3. It is also true that Israel will experience a time of great trouble for God said to them (Jer. 46:28), "I will not leave thee wholly unpunished." This time is spoken of as "the time of Jacob's trouble" (Jer. 30:7), meaning the great tribulation through which Israel and the Gentiles will go - Rom. 2:8-10, but not the Church. Moses referred to this period also near the close of his life (Deut. 31:29), "Evil will befall you in the latter days": (Zech. 14:1-3), "Jerusalem will be besieged" and temporarily

captured.

THERE WILL BE AN UNUSUAL INVASION BY THE NORTHERN POW-ERS AS RECORDED IN EZEKIEL 38-39. I with many Bible students, scholars and writers, and likewise Jewish Rabbis believe this northern invader will be Russia. The late Dr. L. Sale Harrison who held a Bible conference in our church in 1931, said the original text of the word was "Rosho," and meant Russia and would be a terrible tragedy for Israel. He and Dr. Bauman wrote some good books on Russia's invasion of Israel. Note what the prophet Zechariah said (12:2-3), "And in that day will I make Jerusalem a burdensome stone for all people." Now that "burdensome stone" means the nations persecuting Israel will bring divine injury upon themselves for having tried to fit Jerusalem into their political structure which they sought to erect. The city of Jerusalem has been up before the United Nations five times in the last 25 years. In each case no decision was ever reached. This is what Zechariah meant when he said that it would prove a burdensome stone to any nation. Prophecy declares that Israel will ultimately have both a great political and spiritual revival – Ezek. 36-37. In verses 19 and 20 of Ezekiel 11, which is also like as Jeremiah 32:39, you can read these gracious words: "I will give them one heart, and I will put a new spirit within you; and I will take the stony heart out of their flesh, and will give them an heart of flesh: that they may walk in my statutes, and keep my ordinances and do them: and they shall be my people, and I will be their God." These divine words have never come

true yet, but we see movings in that direction. The time will come when the Gentile nations "will come up to Jerusalem to learn the law of the Lord." – Isa. 1:26-27 and 2:2-3 reveal this.

ISAIAH CONTINUED THIS THEME THROUGH **CHAPTERS** Jerusalem eventually will be ruled over by the divine Son of their great king – Jer. 23:5-8; Ezek. 37:24. There can be no kingdom without a king and the King David spoken of in prophecy with reference to the Messiah would be the Messiah himself, which event will take place at the end of the days. (1) Jerusalem will ultimately be the source of universal peace - Isa. 66:10-12; Hag. 2:9. Rom. 9-10-11 Paul declares will bring salvation to the people (Israel). (2) Verses 4-33 in Romans 9 review Israel's past history. Chapter 10 shows present condition today, and chapter 11 declares God has not cast away His people, for Paul himself was an Israelite and saved. (3) Paul says Israel was the true olive branch and because of unbelief broken off and the Gentiles, or the wild olive tree, have been grafted into the true olive tree contrary to nature. These broken branches must be grafted in again to the true olive tree so that "all Israel shall be saved" according to Isaiah 59:20-21. (4) The temple in Jerusalem will be erected (Dan. 12:11; Matt. 24:15; 2 Thess. 2:3-4; Rev. 11:1-10). (5) Because of great tribulation the Jews will become few in number (Deut. 28:62), but "shall blossom and bud, and fill the face of the world with fruit" - Isa. 27:6. Zephaniah says, "I will get them praise and fame in every land where they have been put to shame" - Zeph. 3:19.

hen there are those who trust in and boast of the light of nature. They are worldly-wise. They are always talking about who they are, what they are, what they can do, what they have done, where they have been, what they know, what they plan, etc. They try to impress the world with their importance. Christ said, speaking of this type, "If ye were blind, ye should have no sin; but now ye say, We see; therefore your sin remaineth." (John 9:41) The Pharisees had never faced reality – they did not want to face reality.

When you try to be true to such an individual, and try to get him to face reality, he gets mad with you, because he thinks that you don't love him, that you have it in for him. Usually he is touchy on some point, and when you hit that sore spot, he'll run. because he is unwilling to face reality. Stop sinner! Oh, sinner, will you stop? Look to Christ! Listen to the voice within as He speaks to you, that you may be broken at the feet of Christ and that you might enter into the benefits of the Gospel. Christ said, "I am sent unto the lost sheep... The son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost..." "If our gospel be hid, it is hid to them who are lost... blinded by the god of this world." God saves only lost sinners. Let me whisper that in your ear. Listen sinner, God saves only lost sinners! Are you lost? Are you LOST? Can you throw up your hands and cry, "Father! Oh God, I'm lost! Save me lest I perish! I'm drowning! I'm gone! All hope is gone! I'm at my wit's end!" Sinner, are you lost? Stop sinner; stop and look yourself in the face. May I ask you a question? Will you do what I tell

you to do? Will you go to the mirror, and look yourself squarely in the face, and ask yourself the question, "Am I saved? Do I know Christ?" Will you be honest with yourself? Will you face grim reality? Will you not flee from reality?

Then, there are those who are alive under the law while sin is dead in them - sin has never been revived. They can sit and listen to Gospel preaching and never be moved. Many of them love Gospel preaching - the stronger the better, but they have never been awakened to their danger. If the Holy Spirit moves their heart the least bit, they will stay away from the preaching for a while until all is settled. Christ came to save the condemned - those under condemnation, those who realize they are condemned to die. Christ pardons only guilty sinners. Are you guilty? The sinner must know that he is guilty, acknowledge that he is guilty, take his place as a guilty sinner before God before he can be pardoned. Such a sinner ceases to fight back. Have you stopped fighting back, sinner?

Now let's notice briefly those who benefit by the death and resurrection of Christ. The first are those who are dead in trespasses and sins, but who hear His voice. "They that hear shall live." "You hath he quickened (made alive), who were dead in trespasses and sins." Yes, those who are condemned at the bar of justice, condemned by their own conscience, those who feel the curse as a transgressor of the law, those who feel the weight and burden of their sins, those who are damned as unbelievers of the Gospel...none but such souls as these ever hunger or thirst after the righteousness of Christ, because they alone see their own unrighteousness and

feel and know their need of a covering. What covering do you have for your sins, my friend? Has the Lord God ever passed by you and said, "Live?" Have you ever felt the arrows of God striking deep into your soul? Have you ever faced the fact that you are condemned to die, and that justly? Have your unrighteousness and uncleanness ever been so manifest, or revealed to your heart, until you have cried out for the righteousness of Christ? Then has God ever passed by you and spread His skirt over you and covered your nakedness? Let me probe your heart just a little bit, will vou?

If not - oh, if not, is there a deep desire in your heart that you can't give up, you can't let go, and you don't want to let go until God spreads His skirt of righteousness over you? My sinner friend, is there that deep desire in your heart? A cry, "I must know Christ. I've got to get to Christ. I've got to know Him. I can't live any longer without Him!" There is such a hunger, there's such a thirst in your heart. If there is, you are going to enter into the benefits of the atonement of the Lord Jesus on the cross of Calvary and through the empty tomb. Yes, you will! I believe this with all my heart - that before a sinner gets saved he'll come to hunger and thirst after Christ so much that he's willing to give up every bite of bread that he has. He's willing to surrender his job, his home, his family; he's ready to give up everything under the sun if only he could know Christ as his Lord and his Saviour!

Let me read you a Scripture, my friend, which bears this out, found in Zech. 12:10:

"And I will pour upon the house of David, and upon the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the spirit of grace and of supplications: and they shall look upon me (Christ) whom they have pierced (whom they have cruci-

fied), and they shall mourn for him (for Christ), as one mourneth for his only son, and shall be in bitterness for him (Christ), as one that is in bitterness for his firstborn."

Now, that's Scripture, and that's exactly what happens to every individual who ever gets saved. He looks upon Christ and sees that his sins crucified the Son of God, and there comes such a mourning, such a longing and such a desire, such a hunger in his heart for Christ that he'll be seeking Him. Now that's what he talks about, seeking the Lord, and you can't let go. You say "I will not give up. I'll sit down on the back doorstep of Heaven as a beggar until the Lord Jesus comes by; if it's a million years I'll stay here. I've got to know the Lord."

It's to such a heart as that, that God the Holy Spirit reveals the living Christ, the crucified, buried, risen, and exalted Lord Jesus in the quietness of the hour when all hope is gone, and you are there with your back against the wall. You are facing the Red Sea; you are facing a human impossibility. And then, in that quiet moment the Lord Jesus is revealed to your heart as the living Christ, as the living Saviour, as the living Lord. That's right! Then you have three things - a living Christ, a living Word, and a living believer, and all three are united together. "The words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life." (John 6:63)

Then you'll have a living believer that's raised from the dead and made a new creature in Christ Jesus our Lord. That's the way God saves a sinner. That's right! That's the way God saves a sinner. Yes, now you're going to hunger. There'll come such a hunger in your heart, that you'll want Him. Then, brother, when God reveals Christ to your heart, He comes by revelation and you'll believe Him! You can't turn Him down then! You

rupt. Upon their first conversion, they were often filled with comfort, rejoiced in hope, and found sweet satisfaction in attendance on divine ordinances: and they entertained the fond hope that it would always be thus, or better. They were like little children, dandled on the parent's knee, and not exposed to hardship or required to labor; but soon the scene changes. Darkness hangs over them; difficulties perplex; conflicts discourage them. Inbred corruption begins to stir sensibly, and evils appear which were not believed to exist. The power of temptation is felt; and the Christian finds it to be literally true, that he is engaged in a warfare. Pride rises and attempts to regain its former mastery; passion swells and become impetuous; the baits which the world presents to avarice [extreme greed], ambition, and the love of ease and pleasure, are found to be far more fascinating than was expected. The pleasures of religion too have subsided, and the lively relish for the service of God is abated. Prayer, meditation, and self-examination, once so delightful, now too often are a burden, and are, therefore, frequently neglected, or hastily and carelessly performed. A distressing reluctance to spiritual duties is experienced; and all the pleasures of religion have vanished. Now the Christian may be compared to a weaned child, from which the mother turns herself away, and refuses it its wonted refreshment; or perhaps is better represented by the child sent off from his father's roof, to shift for himself, in a wide and unfriendly world. To increase his affliction, external troubles often combine with those which are inward and spiritual. Malignant enemies rise up to annoy and persecute; friends die, or become unkind; ministers, on whom perhaps

too much dependence was placed, are removed; zealous professors turn back to the world; religion is wounded in the house of her friends; truth lies bleeding in the streets; family comforts decay; and poverty and debt succeed to affluence and comfort; and to crown all, Satan comes forth with a frightful roar, and endeavors to worry whom he knows he cannot devour. Now, indeed, the feeble, timid soul is pressed beyond expression. It groans "being burdened;" almost wishes for death; not because conscious of preparation for a better world, but as a release from trouble. Sometimes, under these afflictions, especially when bodily health is impaired, or a good name blasted by the tongue of calumny [slander], the soul grows pettish and impatient; and the feelings, if expressed in words, would be something like this, "Why am I thus? Why am I left to buffet the storm without help or refuge? Why am I abandoned of God, and made a reproach to my enemies, who daily say, scoffingly, 'Where is now your God, in whom you trusted? There is no help for him in Or more commonly, the afflicted and heavy-laden soul, sinks into despondency, and concludes that it never has been in the right way; that surely, if it was one of God's dear children, it would never be thus forsaken and left to sink in the horrible pit and miry clay. "Surely," it exclaims, "this cannot be the way in which Jehovah leads his own dear children, whom he hath redeemed." Were it not that now and then there is "a little reviving" in the midst of these years of affliction; unless, after long intervals of thick darkness, some rays of cheerful light gilded the dark scene, and some drops of refreshment fell into the cup of sorrow, the soul would be overwhelmed (Continued on Page 11)


would not turn Him down under any condition. That's right! That's what Paul said, "The Gospel I preach came by revelation...and when it pleased God to reveal his Son in me..." Then he said, "We are shut up under the law unto faith" (with a heart of unbelief) – or, "until faith is revealed," and faith is revealed when the living Christ is revealed to your heart. Then you'll lay hold of Him, and it's no trouble to believe, is it?

Sinner friend, you've racked your brain, you've practically burned your brain out, trying to believe, but you can't. You can't! Rest before Him and look to Him; ask Him to reveal Christ to your heart. "Make Him real to me, Lord. I do believe; help thou my unbelief. I do believé." Sit there as a beggar at His feet until He has been revealed to your heart. "Flesh and blood hath not revealed this unto thee," Christ said to Peter, "but my Father, which is in heaven." The Son lies in the bosom of the Father, and He is given to whom God will reveal Him. He is sovereign. He is eternal. My friend, it's the greatest thing in the world to know that living Christ. I know what I'm talking about. I know! I'll stake my eternal destiny upon it. There's the storm center of the battle ground right there. There it is - that

salvation comes to the human heart by REVELATION. "Salvation is of the LORD." (Jonah 2:9) But you are going to face reality.

Then those who are meek will enter into the benefits of the Gospel. Christ said, "He hath sent me to preach good tidings to the meek." The meek are the only ones who will hear the tidings. Only the soul that is bowed down through grief and anguish and trouble and distress - only the soul that is so dismayed and dejected that it cannot bear a harsh word because his spirit is sunk so low through continual sorrow of heart and grief of mind will listen to the Gospel. He wants deliverance. He wants the comfort, the peace, the pardon, the deliverance of the Gospel. Yes, those who are broken by the cutting convictions of God's Word – they are broken by the terrors of the law - they are broken by the accusations of Satan - they are broken by the reproaches of those who are at ease - they will know the binding up of their broken hearts by the hand of the Lord Jesus when He pours oil and wine of the Gospel into their wounded hearts - the oil, the grace of God for healing; the wine, the joy of the Gospel. Do you know Him?

with a burden which human strength is unable to bear.

But how is this the way of sanctification? It looks more like the path of declension and apostasy. But remember, that before we can ascend we must descend; before we can be filled with the divine fullness, we must be emptied of self and sin. To bring us to feel our weakness and entire dependence, we must be left to try our own strength; and to convince us of the evil of sin, we must, for a season, be left to struggle against its power, and to learn to know the "depths of Satan." To cure us of the undue love of the world, the world must be "crucified to us, and we to it;" and to preserve us from idolizing the creature, the objects of our too fond affections must be snatched away from our embrace. But, doubtless, this is a way which the people of God did not know, until they were led into it. Even when forewarned by experienced Christians, of the difficulties and dangers of the way, they heeded them not; as either not understanding what they meant, or as not giving full credit to their testimony.

4. Another thing in the dispensations of God to his people which, prior to experience, they never distinctly understood, and which cannot easily be explained, is his leaving them for a season to backslide; and then recovering them by the exercise of the same sovereign grace which first brought them into the path of life.

The young convert cannot believe that he shall every grow cold and decline in piety, much less that he may be left to commit some grievous sin, to the sore wounding of his conscience, and perhaps the dishonor of his profession. But, notwithstanding his strong confidence, which leads him to boast, "my mountain standeth strong, I shall never be moved," it will not be a new thing on the earth, or in the church, if he should add one more beacon to the many with which this coast is already strewed, to be a warning to those who come after him. Backsliding begins in the heart, shows itself in the closet first, and soon diffuses its paralyzing influence through the life. The backslider for a while may preserve a fair exterior; his public devotions may appear to be punctual and fervent, while in secret he is cold and careless. The Christian while in this declining state, differs so little from the hypocrite, that it is not easy discriminate between them. Indeed, to the man himself, this is commonly impossible, and happily so; for when love grows cold, fear must be brought to operate on the natural feelings. If backsliders possess assurance, it is the assurance of delusion. While thus departing from God, they cannot possess satisfactory evidence of his favor, for the exercise of grace is its evidence. The symptoms of backsliding are evident enough. The want of lively faith, and love, and penitence, is the root of the evil. The reality, beauty, and importance of eternal things, are out of view; the world, therefore rises in magnitude, and seems clothed with new interest and its objects appear more desirable. Seriousness of spirit is now succeeded by levity, and that tenderness of conscience which shuddered at the mere "appearance of evil," by stupidity. The spirit of the world gains too great ascendancy; and conformity to the corrupt maxims and customs of the world becomes manifest. Even lawful objects are sought with too much ardor, and the too anxious desire to be rich has often entangled the souls of professors in many hurtful snares,

from which some are never extricated, but their souls are finally pierced through with many sorrows, and drowned in perdition.

When backsliding once begins, there is no knowing how far the declining Christian may depart from God. It cannot be a matter of much surprise, therefore, that in an evil hour, and under the power of temptation, some insidious lust should prevail against him, and should carry him into captivity. Indeed, such is the frailty of the best men, that there is no security for their not falling into gross sins, but in the conservative grace of God; and when Christians begin to backslide they never recover themselves, and return by their own efforts; but by the kind interposition of their faithful Shepherd, whose love to his sheep leads him to leave the ninety and nine, and to go into the wilderness to reclaim one straying lamb. He makes his voice to be heard and recognized. If the common warnings of the word, and gentle suggestions of the Spirit have been neglected, or resisted, it is usual with him to apply the rod. Providence is made to cooperate powerfully with grace; or rather is made a part of that system of gracious means, which God makes use of to preserve and reclaim his erring people; and in the corrective dispensations of Providence, there can often be remarked a connection between our sin and God's chastisement. Often the objects which have been the occasion of our sin, are somehow made the instruments of our punishment; or in some way and by some association observed by us, God points as with a finger, by his dispensations of affliction, to sins long since committed and perhaps almost forgotten. The riches which were too eagerly sought, "make to themselves wings and fly away," as the eagle to heaven; or those for whom these riches were so painfully accumulated, are taken away. If we make an idol of any creature, God will often judge it best to remove the stumbling-block, and make room for himself in our affections. Our heavenly Father knows how to direct the rod so as to produce the desired effect. He knows our frame, and can pierce the point of sensibility, and thus rouse us from our apathy, or from our dreams of worldly pleasure and ambition. The backslider is now arrested in his downward course, is brought to pause and consider his ways. He now sees how far he has departed from the right path. He is convinced of his folly and sin, in forsaking "the fountain of living waters, and hewing out broken cisterns which can hold no water." The convictions of sin in the case of the backslider, are often attended with keener compunction and anguish, than were experienced under his first awakening. Sometimes he almost despairs of mercy; or if he dares to cherish a trembling hope of acceptance, yet he expects no more kind and gracious dealings from his heavenly Father. He calculates, like the returning prodigal, to be placed on the footing of "a hired servant," rather than that of a son. But here again he is led by a path which he knew not; for God not only "heals his backsliding," but graciously forgives all his aggravated sins; receives him as a child, without upbraiding; draws him with loving cords, even the bands of a man, and says, "I will heal their backsliding, I will love them freely: for mine anger is turned away from him."

This abounding of free grace and pardoning mercy to backsliding believers, is one of the most wonderful things in the way in which God

THE PRAYER OF FAITH

As mentioned in the hymn, "When mothers of Salem their children brought to Jesus" they were setting an example which many mothers have followed since (see Luke 18:15-16). How often it is said of one or another, "He was a child of many prayers"! When the story of God's saving grace to a soul is told, how often is the confession made, "I had a praying mother." Timothy had a praying mother; so had Augustine: so had John Newton, and countless others. The Hebrew mothers, bringing their babies and toddlers to the Lord Jesus Christ, showed us that it is never too soon to begin.

Mothers who pray for their children often see their prayers answered, and their darlings growing up in the fear of the Lord. Eunice must have been the happy result of her care for Timothy's spiritual welfare. Monica, after years of agonizing in prayer, saw her beloved son, Augustine, brought into the light. But it is not always the Lord's plan to let us know that our prayers are granted. Sometimes the conversion of a prayed-for child does not take place until long after the

death of the praying mother. Yet mothers should never cease to pray in faith, though the answer may be long in coming.

There was once a poor woman named Susan, left a widow with a little girl called Kitty. Susan was a true Christian, and what she wanted most for her child was to see her too "in Christ." She did all she could to teach the little one of God and of His way of salvation, reading to her from the Bible, and making her learn passages by heart.

But Kitty showed no response. She was always impatient of her mother's words and lessons, and would rush off to play with other children the moment she was free.

One Sunday, when Kitty was growing older, she ran off with some other rough children against her mother's wishes, and stayed all day. Susan was greatly worried, and, when the child turned up at last, she spoke seriously to her about her wrongdoing. But Kitty would not listen, and even answered back rudely. Seeing her so sulky and obstinate, Susan went away to her bedroom, greatly distressed. Kneeling at her bed, with sobs and tears she besought the Lord for her little daughter, that He would change her heart.

Left alone in the kitchen, Kitty heard her mother's voice in the bedroom, and thought she must be telling someone else of her naughtiness. Creeping to the door, she peeped through the keyhole. There was nobody there besides her mother, and she saw that she was praying for her. It was quite enough for Kitty; she ran off at once to her playmates, and forgot the incident altogether.

Kitty grew up hard and willful, and when she married, she was a bad wife to her husband and a bad mother to her children. Her godly mother Susan died soon after her marriage, praying to the end in faith that Kitty might be saved.

My dear friend:

I am speaking to all who class yourselves among those known as "awakened sinners," but I realize that the majority of you have only a vague idea of what it means to be awakened. You are drifting along half asleep, half awake – drifting, with no definite purpose or aim directed toward getting to Christ. Now, what is the reason for such a state as you are in? It is that your heart is not opened and fully sensible to the truth of your condition and the danger you abide in each moment you are out of Christ.

Therefore, your greatest need – and the greatest need that all believers should pray for – is that YOUR HEART MAY BE OPENED. This is the work of the Holy Spirit, and as you take time to read this and meditate on these thoughts, ask the Lord by His Holy Spirit to cause the Word to sink deep into your heart and open it to its very depths. If your heart is not broken up to receive the Word, it will continue to be like the first three kinds of ground in the Parable of the Sower.

Let's look at the Sower (Matt.13:3-9) sowing the seed. As God's messenger preaches the Word, it is broadcast over the fields. It is the Seed of Life that springs up into Eternal Life that shall never perish. He sows sufficient seed, and he covers the entire field, even the wayside, the turn row. He sows good seed. The Scripture tells us, that the Field is the world and the seed is the Word.

Are you the WAYSIDE heart that the seeds of the Word merely fall upon, and there lie until the birds snatch them away? Let's see if we can describe your WAY-SIDE heart. All week long your heart and mind is trodden back and forth, like a busy thoroughfare, by wicked thoughts until the soft ground is packed and hardened by the time the Lord's Day morning arrives. Worldly thoughts rush to and fro, in the mad frenzy of covetous desire to make money, get ahead, planning, scheming, maneuvering, pulling strings to close this deal, put over that plan. Malicious thoughts are invited along the way to keep you company and entertain an empty heart with a constant thoroughfare of wicked imaginations passing night and day through the unregenerate heart and mind. Then when the messenger pours out his heart, entreating you to trust the Lord Jesus Christ, you say, "I can't trust Him; I don't know how to trust Him." The Word of Life falls on calloused hearts, and does not move you to embrace the Lord as your Lord. When he preaches on the wickedness of your heart, and the danger you are in, it may merely scratch the surface of the ground, which is but trampled again the moment the service is over, and you are no nearer a knowledge of your condition before God.

Perhaps your heart is a STONY heart. Among the stones, there is some good soil, soft ground, and the Word falls upon your heart, and you like it, you embrace it, you are drawn to it. You listen with eagerness, and nothing can keep you away from a service. It seems that you are near the kingdom, as we say. Suddenly you become offended, and your attention is drawn away to some so-called stumbling block, and there you stay, hung up on some stone in the ground of your heart. It may be that you stumble over some sin in your life that lies buried beneath the surface, and you

say, "I just can't give up this" – it may be cigarettes, or something else; "and I can't come over that." It may be resentment against some individual, and all you can do is dwell on that individual until you search out all his faults and clothe him with some great crime to justify you in not giving up this stone of your resentment against him. There are two marks by which you may know whether you are one of these unfruitful listeners: (1) Your ROCKY HEART will remain the same, because it has never been broken by conviction of sin; and (2) You will endure for a while, and then slowly drift away from whatever conviction you may have had and drift back into a deeper state of rebellion.

But you may have come farther along the path of Holy Spirit conviction of sin, where the Holy Spirit has plowed up the depths of your heart and pulled out the rocks and dug up the old stumps. You have given up everything that the Holy Spirit has put His finger on in cleaning up your wicked life. You have relinquished all your prejudices, jealousies, and resentments of every individual you know, and you have cleaned your life of every secret grudge, as the Holy Spirit dug them out and showed them to you. The Word has come to mean something to you; it springs up in your heart. But the THORNS are also springing up - thorns of CARE that beset you on every hand and take your mind from the Lord; thorns of PLANS you are making for the present and the future; thorns of ACTIVITIES you are loading your life down with; thorns of BILLS you are burdening your budget with. These things crowd out the Word and your meditation upon Him. They are distractions, which ultimately choke out the Lord, and which Satan uses to cheat you of the precious time the Lord has given you to seek Him. Remember that thorns and flowers cannot grow in the same ground, and the thorns will always choke out the flowers. Pray to be made willing to leave all for Christ.

I pray that the Lord has broken up the fallow ground, dug out all the stones, and burned all the briers in your heart and prepared a good ground, because a BROKEN HEART alone can receive the good Word of God, the Living Word, who is Christ crucified, buried, and risen. When the Word is received, the Holy Spirit in you waters it with prayer until it brings forth fruit unto holiness.

My dear friend, examine your heart, whether ye be in the way of grace. Has the hard-beaten track of Satan and his wicked thoughts been broken up, and all those wicked thoughts cut off, all those selfish, rebellious, independent thoughts ceased? Has the stony ground been dug out, and all those sins of the flesh, pride, hatred, jealousy, resentment all been dragged out and cast away? Have the thorns been cut down and the roots dug out that occupied the ground of your heart and sapped up the time, energy, and means that should be devoted to cultivating the Word of God? A broken, pulverized ground offers no resistance, and therefore, it cannot resist the claims of the Lordship of the Son of God. It cannot hold out against the love of the dying Saviour, and it cannot help but fall down upon the promises and receive the Living Word, Christ Jesus your Lord. "A broken and a contrite heart I will not despise," saith the Lord Jehovah to every sinner. Cry for a broken heart, and then let Him break it. "Every one that asketh receiveth ..."

Face to Face

Carrie E. Breck, 1855-1934

"For now we see through a glass, darkly; but then face to face...

(1 Corinthians 13:12)

The author, Carrie E. Breck, was born on January 22, 1855, at Walden, Vermont. Eight years later, her family moved to Vineland, New Jersey. There she met her husband, a local

farmer, and lived most of her life with him and their five daughters. In 1914, family moved to Portland, Oregon, where she remained until her death on March 27, 1934.

Mrs. Breck was known as a deeply-committed Christian and a life-long Presbyterian. She wrote more than 2,000 poems, a number of which have become hymn texts. including "Shall I Crucify My Savior" and "Nailed to the Cross." Mrs. Breck has

left the following account of her busy life as a wife, mother, and writer: "I penciled verses under all conditions; over a mending basket, with a baby on my arm, and sometimes even when sweeping or washing dishes - my mind moved in poetic meter. Interestingly, it was said of Carrie Breck that "she could not carry a tune and had no natural sense of pitch, but she had a keen sense of rhythm and loved music." Her spiritual gift was composing the words, the composing of the music she gladly left to others.

One of those music composers was Grant Colfax Tullar, a Methodist min-The circumstances of his collaboration on the hymn "Face to Face" shows how God can bring together

writer and musician, words and music to become a song that was destined for many a hymn book, and to bring many a blessing.

Mr. Tullar was working with an evangelist during a busy gospel meeting in Rutherford, New Jersey, and a number of them had gone to the local pastor's home for supper one evening. As they all sat around the table, the pastor's wife, knowing how much Grant loved jams and jellies, passed

him the jar of jelly, which at that point had very little jelly left. Grant wrote, "As I started to help myself I said, 'So, this is all for me, is it?!' At that instant, 'all for me' as a theme for a song thrust itself upon my mind with such force that I placed the dish again on the table without taking any jelly, and excusing myself, went to the piano and wrote the melody and a few verses, the first one beginning: 'All for me the

Carrie E. Breck Savior suffered, All for me He bled and died.' The pastor asked if

he might sing it at the service, that night, at which he told the people the story of its writing."

The next morning, as Tullar sat down and prepared to work on the words of the song a bit more, the postman came and delivered a special letter to him from Carrie E. Breck who had heard he was there working with a crusade. She said she had written a poem and wanted to know if he could put it to music. "As I started to read it," Grant wrote, "I discovered that it exactly fitted my music written the night before! No word of her poem nor my music needed to be changed!" That hymn was/is "Face To Face"

leads his blind people. When they were looking for nothing but wrath, behold he shows his reconciled face, and manifests his pardoning mercy with all the tenderness of a kind father. It is by such dispensations of love and mercy, that God proves to us how superior he is to all our highest conceptions. That he is God, and not man, is the reason why his people are not consumed. "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the LORD. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts."

It should not be inferred from what has been said, that God leads all his people in precisely the same paths; for while there is generally a similarity, there is a particular diversity. The case of every Christian has probably something peculiar in it; both as it relates to the work of grace within him, and to the dispensations of Providence without him. There are some individuals who are led in a way remarkably different from the common paths of the flock. They are conducted through the world in a gentle, peaceful course; exposed but little to the fierce blasts of adversity, with which others are assailed and almost overwhelmed; and seem to be preserved from those terrific conflicts, and satanic temptations, which others are called to endure; while to others the path is hedged up and full of difficulties throughout. But often, while the first states of the pilgrimage are smooth, the latter may be rough and painful, or the reverse. During a long season of prosperity and peace, the cup of afflictions is filling up ready to be poured forth at a future day. Indeed, according to the order of natural events, it must be so; for if all the

members of a large family are, for many years, spared, there are only so many more marks for the arrows of future adversity; for all these are subject to various misfortunes, and all these must die, sooner or later, as well as others. Those, therefore, who seem for a while to be exempt from adversity, will in due season have their full share; unless in mercy they are "taken away from the evil to come."

5. Finally, the people of God are often conducted through the "valley and shadow of death" in an unexpected manner. We learn, that anciently there were some "who were all their lives subject to bondage, through fear of death;" whom Christ came to deliver. Well, that bondage of fear is still experienced by many sincere, but timid Christians; and many anxious thoughts are felt in relation to this awful but inevitable event. Yet when the trying moment arrives – when death appears near, and the evident symptoms of approaching dissolution are experienced – they find themselves supported and comforted, far beyond their highest expectation; and, as his last enemy comes nearer, he appears less formidable: his sting is extracted; and sometimes he seems to assume the face of an angel of light; so that the dying Christian can often say, "O death, where is thy sting?" "For me to die is gain." This peaceful end is not reserved for those alone, who appeared, in life, to possess a strong faith, but doubting, desponding believers are often thus raised above their gloomy fears, and are enabled to triumph in a dying hour. The faithful Shepherd of Israel is always present to guide the sheep of his purchase through this gloomy valley. Although they are blind and know not the way, yet with his rod and his staff will he

both guide and protect them. Happy they who have God for their guide.

INFERENCES.

1. We may learn from what has been said, the end to be accomplished by the various dispensations of God to his people is, to humble their pride, to divest them of self-righteousness and self-confidence – to lead them to appreciate the grace and faithfulness of the Savior; and to give exercise to the several virtues of the Christian life, and thus to prepare the soul for its heavenly state.

2. Believers, by being led in this way, are instructed in the knowledge of the deep depravity of their nature; the deceitfulness of the heart; the turpitude of sin, in its various forms and aspects; of the malice and subtlety of the grand adversary; and consequently of the riches of divine grace; the wonderful wisdom of the plan of redemption; the tender sympathy, as well as the faithful care, of the Mediator; and of the desirableness of a better rest than this world can afford. Our estimation of heavenly joys will have some relation to our conflicts and afflictions upon earth. No doubt the gratitude of the redeemed, on Mount Zion, is increased exceedingly, by the consideration that they "have come out of great tribulation.

3. Let us learn then to trust implicitly in the providence and in the promises of a covenant-keeping God. His providence extends to the hairs of our head, and his promises are all yea and amen in Christ Jesus, and are "exceeding great and precious." We should learn to live upon the promises, by the exercise of a lively faith and hope, trusting all our interests into the hands of a faithful Redeemer - confidently believing, that whatever he hath promised he will certainly perform. Hath he begun a good work, and will he not accomplish it? None who trust in him shall ever be disappointed; and the more confidently we rely upon his word of promise, the more is he honored, and the more acceptable are we in his sight.



The teacher had thought it best to take no notice of the change in Kitty's behavior, but when he found the neighbors saying what a completely different woman she had become, he



The sight of her little girl at the keyhole brought back to her mind her mother's prayers. With overwhelming conviction, the remembrance of all her evil ways rushed in upon her. She wondered how God could have spared her from judgment for so long. Shutting herself into her own room, Kitty prayed, prayed for the first time in her life, that God would be merciful to her, a sinner. "And God heard me," she said earnestly; "He did not cast me off, though I've been so wicked; and He has answered my mother's prayers at last, and given me a new heart."

The change proved indeed to be real. For the sake of the Savior who bore her sins in His own body on the tree, God forgave Kitty and clothed her in the righteousness of Christ.

So Susan's prayers were granted. Perhaps you will say it was sad that she never knew on earth of the answer being given. But we need not think of that. The Lord knew what was best for Susan, as He does for each of His children; and when He took her into His presence, she found fulness of joy was her portion forever.


Aaron was born in Flora, Mississippi, the middle child of three. He attended Jackson public schools. He played the tuba, loved fishing and loved to drive fast

cars. He graduated from Brinkley High School in 1966.


